Topics Overview:

Cal-OSHA: In 2009, California has already seen a 12% spike in Cal-OSHA citations at manufacturing facilities. At the March 25th seminar, you will receive a detailed report on when Cal-OSHA must inspect, what are the typical citations, documentation, and training. The report will also include a “virtual” inspection where attendees review photos and pick out the common (and uncommon) violations.



Going Beyond Energy Efficiency: Even during tough economic times, companies look for ways to train employees, educate their workforce, streamline their operations, and cut costs. Southern California Edison will share information on some old—and new—avenues for achieving your goals during tough economic times.



SCAQMD Permitting Problems: Take a look at your permits. If you had a permit issued by the SCAQMD between September 2006 and January 2009 the permit may get revoked. Future permits distributed by the SCAQMD may also be at risk, or subject to purchasing expensive offset emission credits. This is all due to a lawsuit filed against the SCAQMD in 2007. SCAQMD lost the lawsuit and thousands of permits issued under Rule 1304 and 1309.1 were deemed invalid. Companies can still operate under existing permits while the SCAQMD appeals the decision. But to be sure of your status and how the ruling impacts your operations, join us at the seminar on March 25 in Downey.
